

Lenten Devotional

1	John 1:38-39	³⁸ When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" ³⁹ He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon.
2	John 1:43	⁴³ The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me."
3	John 2:17	¹⁷ His disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me."
4	John 3:16	¹⁶ "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.
5	John 4:14	¹⁴ but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life."
6	Luke 3:19-20	¹⁹ But Herod the ruler, who had been rebuked by him because of Herodias, his brother's wife, and because of all the evil things that Herod had done, ²⁰ added to them all by shutting up John in prison.
7	Mark 1:15	¹⁵ and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."
8	Luke 5:10-11	¹⁰ and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." ¹¹ When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.
9	John 4:50	⁵⁰ Jesus said to him, "Go; your son will live." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and started on his way.
10	Matthew 8:2-3	² and there was a leper who came to him and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, if you choose, you can make me clean." ³ He stretched out his hand and touched him, saying, "I do choose. Be made clean!" Immediately his leprosy was cleansed.
11	Mark 4:39-40	³⁹ He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. ⁴⁰ He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?"
12	Mark 5:15	¹⁵ They came to Jesus and saw the demoniac sitting there, clothed and in his right mind, the very man who had had the legion; and they were afraid.
13	Mark 5:34	³⁴ He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."
14	Luke 5:20	²⁰ When he saw their faith, he said, "Friend, your sins are forgiven you."
15	John 5:8	⁸ Jesus said to him, "Stand up, take your mat and walk."
16	Luke 6:13	¹³ And when day came, he called his disciples and chose twelve of them, whom he also named apostles:
17	Luke 7:21-22	²¹ Jesus had just then cured many people of diseases, plagues, and evil spirits, and had given sight to many who were blind. ²² And he answered them, "Go and tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, the poor have good news brought to them.
18	Luke 8:1-2	¹ Soon afterwards he went on through cities and villages, proclaiming and bringing the good news of the kingdom of God. The twelve were with him, ² as well as some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities: Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out,
19	Matthew 13:45-46	⁴⁵ "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; ⁴⁶ on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it.

20	Luke 9:2-3	² and he sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal. ³ He said to them, "Take nothing for your journey, no staff, nor bag, nor bread, nor money—not even an extra tunic.
21	Mark 6:14	⁴ King Herod heard of it, for Jesus' name had become known. Some were saying, "John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him."
22	John 6:11	¹¹ Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted.
23	John 6:19-20	¹⁹ When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. ²⁰ But he said to them, "It is I; do not be afraid."
24	Mark 6:54-55	⁵⁴ When they got out of the boat, people at once recognized him, ⁵⁵ and rushed about that whole region and began to bring the sick on mats to wherever they heard he was.
25	John 9:3	³ Jesus answered, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned; he was born blind so that God's works might be revealed in him.
26	Matthew 16:13	¹³ Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?"
27	Luke 9:22	²² saying, "The Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, chief priests, and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised."
28	Luke 9:48	⁴⁸ and said to them, "Whoever welcomes this child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me; for the least among all of you is the greatest."
29	Matthew 18:14	¹⁴ So it is not the will of your Father in heaven that one of these little ones should be lost
30	Luke 9:51	⁵¹ When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem.
31	Luke 19:9-10	⁹ Then Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he too is a son of Abraham. ¹⁰ For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost."
32	Mark 11:9	⁹ Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!
33	Matthew 24:44	⁴⁴ Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.
34	John 17:21	²¹ that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us,[a] so that the world may believe that you have sent me.
35	Mark 15:24	²⁴ And they crucified him, and divided his clothes among them, casting lots to decide what each should take.
36	Luke 23:42-43	⁴² Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into[a] your kingdom." ⁴³ He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."
37	Luke 23:45	⁴⁵ while the sun's light failed; and the curtain of the temple was torn in two.
38	Luke 23:46	⁴⁶ Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Having said this, he breathed his last.
39	John 19:28	²⁸ After this, when Jesus knew that all was now finished, he said (in order to fulfill the scripture), "I am thirsty."
40	Luke 23:47	⁴⁷ When the centurion saw what had taken place, he praised God and said, "Certainly this man was innocent."
41	Mark 15:37-38	³⁷ Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. ³⁸ And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom.
42	John 19:33-34	³³ But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. ³⁴ Instead, one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once blood and water came out.
43	Mark 15:4	⁴⁶ Then Joseph bought a linen cloth, and taking down the body, wrapped it in the linen cloth, and laid it in a tomb that had been hewn out of the rock. He then rolled a stone against the door of the tomb.
