TODAY FROM THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH

While at the university and enjoying the happiness of being able to study and even to produce some results in science and art—I could not help thinking continually of others who were denied that happiness by their material circumstances or by their health. Then one brilliant summer morning at Gunsbach during the Whitsuntide holidays... there came to me, as I awoke, the thought that I could not accept this happiness as a matter of course, but must give up something in return for it. Proceeding to think the matter out at once with calm deliberation—while the birds were singing outside, I settled with myself before I got up that I would consider myself justified in living until I was thirty for science and art, in order to devote myself from that time onward to the direct service of humanity. Many a time already had I tried to settle what meaning lay hidden for me in the saying of Jesus: “Whoever would save his life shall lose it, and whosoever shall lose his life for my sake and the Gospel’s shall save it.” Now the answer was found. In addition to the outward, I now had the inward happiness.
