

#450 HYMN OF THE DAY I Bind unto Myself Today

ATHANASIAN CREED (Edited)

The Christian faith is this: We worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the divine being.

For the Father is one Person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is still another. But the Godhead of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is all one, equal in glory, co-eternal in majesty. What the Father is, the Son is, and so is the Holy Spirit. So the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God. And yet they are not three Gods but one God.

Thus the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, and the Holy Spirit is Lord. And yet there are not three Lords but one Lord. As Christian truth compels us to acknowledge each distinct Person by Himself as God and Lord, so the Christian faith forbids us to say that there are three Gods or three Lords.

The Father is made of one, neither created nor begotten. The Son is of the Father alone, not made nor created but begotten. The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten but proceeding.

So there is the Father, not three Fathers, one Son, not three Sons, one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits. And in this Trinity no one is before or after, greater or less than the other; but all three Persons are in themselves, co-eternal and co-equal, and so we must worship the Trinity in unity and the one God in three persons.






