


The heart is devious above all else; it is perverse—who can understand it? I the Lord test the mind and search the heart, to give to all according to their ways, according to the fruit of their doings.

We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

TODAY FROM THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH

The rude offense of the cross is hidden away under flowers. A gallows turned into a floral tribute!—for use at funerals! Jesus is represented as amazingly gentle, a good deal gentler than he ever was, and becomes the mild friend of man. God himself is little more than the superlative of human kindness and couldn't possibly be hard on anyone! We sing, "Come Hither, Ye Faithful," but leave out that phrase about "the angels' dread king." It isn't good for children. One of our books takes the old Russian hymn which used to read, "God the All-terrible King who ordaineth," and makes it start, "God the all-Merciful."

If we don't quit that kind of milkand-water nonsense now, we shall soon be much worse off than we have ever been. Our sensitive, tender little delicacies won't get us very far.
